Disability Discrimination & Harassment It is illegal to harass an applicant or employee because he or she has a disability, had a disability in the past, or is believed to have a physical or mental impairment that is not transitory (lasting or expected to last six months or less) and minor (even if he or she does not have such an impairment).

### THE LAW OF DISABILITY DISCRIMINATION

The Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) is the main federal law protecting the disabled from discrimination in the areas of employment, state and local government, public accommodations, commercial facilities (such as restaurants and stores), transportation, and telecommunications.
