The RCA process provides you with a way to identify breakdowns in processes and systems that contributed to the event and how to prevent future events.

Guidance for Performing Root Cause Analysis (RCA) with PIPs

A root cause is defined as a factor that caused a nonconformance and should be permanently eliminated through process improvement. The root cause is the core issue—the highest-level cause—that sets in motion the entire cause-and-effect reaction that ultimately leads to the problem (s). Root cause analysis (RCA) is defined as a collective term that describes a wide range of approaches, tools, and techniques used to uncover causes of problems.
